The Sphere movement

- Started in 1997 by NGOs and the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.
- Developed a Humanitarian Charter and humanitarian standards to be applied in humanitarian response.
- The Sphere Handbook is a primary reference tool for national and international NGOs, volunteers, UN agencies, governments and donors.
- Sphere is a worldwide community working to improve the quality and accountability of humanitarian assistance.



How it all began...





The Sphere philosophy

The Sphere philosophy is based on two core beliefs:

1. People affected by disaster or conflict have **the right to life** with <u>dignity</u> and, therefore, the right to assistance.

2. All possible steps should be taken to alleviate human suffering arising out of disaster or conflict.



What is in the Handbook?

The Handbook is Sphere's flagship publication. It includes the Humanitarian Charter, the Protection Principles, the Core Humanitarian Standard, and Minimum Standards in four vital areas of response:

- Water supply, sanitation and hygiene promotion (WASH)
- Food security and nutrition lacksquare
- Shelter and settlement
- Health

Partner organisations have developed standards in several sectors, based on the same philosophy and commitments as Sphere's. These are available through Sphere, the Humanitarian Standards Partnership and the partner organisations' own websites.

90% of Ukrainian refugees are women and children

Sphere's Programme for Ukraine and Eastern Europe

- Launched in mid-2022 in response to the war in Ukraine
- Clear need to learn about and apply humanitarian standards not a single trainer or focal point in this part of Europe (with some exceptions)
- 5 countries: Ukraine, Poland, Romania, Slovakia and Moldova most affected by displacement
- 4 languages for the new

Sphere Handbook Translation

Перше п<u>ілотне робне</u>видання Посібника було випущено <u>опубліковано</u> у 1998 році, а у 2000, 2004, 2011 і тепер у 2018 році роках до нього було <u>видано</u> внесено з мін<u>ені та доповнені версії Посібника</u>и та доповнення. Вони описують зобов'язання та процеси, які забезпечують якіс<u>ть</u> не-надання гуманітарної допомоги і заохочують організації, які надають <u>цю-таку</u> допомогу, бути підзвітними перед населенням, на яке впливають їхні дії. Ці розділи забезпечують ефективне застосування мінімальних стандартів у будь-якому контексті. Network building

Members: organizations and individuals - a special membership procedure participation in the decision of strategic issues and the right to vote, etc.

Focal points – representatives of countries - contact persons and promoters of Sphere on the ground

Trainers – professional trainers of Sphere standards

Most of them are volunteers and cooperate with Sphere because they BELIEVE in it!

The Society Development Institute (SDI) and the Asociácia samaritánov Slovenskej republiky (AS-SR) jointly became Sphere's focal point for the Slovak Republic in March 2023.

- recognises that people have a right to protection and assistance with dignity; and
- provides the ethical and legal foundation for the Protection Principles, the Core Humanitarian Standard, and the Sphere Minimum Standards.

Protection Principles

A practical translation of the Humanitarian Charter into four principles to guide humanitarian response:

- **1.** Enhance people's safety, dignity, and rights and avoid exposing them to further harm.
- 2. Ensure people's access to impartial assistance, according to need and without discrimination.
- **3.** Assist people to recover from the physical and psychological effects of ...
- 4. Help people to claim their rights.







Key actions

Key actions outline practical steps to attain the Minimum Standard. These are suggestions and may not be applicable in all contexts. Users should select those most relevant to the situation.

Key indicators

Key indicators serve as signals to indicate whether the standard they support is being attained.

Specific numbers (targets) are only included where there is sectoral consensus or scientific evidence.

Guidance notes provide additional information to support the key actions, with cross-references to the Protection Principles, the Core Humanitarian Standard, other standards in the Handbook and other standards of the Humanitarian Standards Partnership.

Using the indicators

The Sphere key indicators are a way to measure whether a standard is being achieved; they should not be confused with the standard itself. The standard is universal, but the key indicators, like the key actions, should be considered in light of both the context and phase of the response.

Standards v. indicators

- Pursuing indicators rather than standards is to assume that everyone is born with equal needs, rather than equal **rights**, which is a potentially harmful error.
- Always consider the context, including the needs, capacities and vulnerabilities of the people you are trying to assist.
- People affected by crisis should participate actively at every stage of the response.
