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The HSP challenge

Today's scenario: You are responding to the devastating 7.7 and 7.6 magnitude earthquakes that struck Southeast Türkiye and bordering Syria on 6 and 7 February 2023.

These earthquakes represent two of the largest to have hit Türkiye in the last century, and one of the deadliest experienced by the country. The aftershocks impacted at least 10 provinces.

How can minimum humanitarian standards help you in the different situations you encounter?

Aim


 To test capabilities developed within DPPI SEE training program through a field simulation exercise.

Objectives


- Test the existing drone flying capacities of the member states.


Step 1: Familiarise participants with Sphere Handbook before event

1. In-person trainings:

- Sphere Handbook
- Sphere in Urban Settings

2. Online trainings such as:

- How to use the Sphere Handbook
- How to be a Sphere Champion
- Sphere in Practice
- Introduction to the Minimum
 Standards for Camp Management





Step 2: Tasking done by experienced Sphere Incident Commander

DAY 1 - Start with BRIEFING (DEMOGRAPHICS & AIM)

- To assess potential locations and choose the most appropriate one for Camp in accordance with the Sphere standards
- 2. To map all available capacities relevant and needed for the response
- To poject type of assistance and calculate amount of assistance needed in order to respond in accordance with the Sphere standards
- 4. To map the Camp in accordance with the Sphere standards

End with DEBRIEFING

















Step 3: Mapping accompanied by Sphere trainers

DAY 2 - Start with BRIEFING

- 1. To map service areas in the camp e.g. First Aid, Prayer, Children's Play in accordance with Sphere standards
- To define type and quantities of support needed from the Logistics Team
- 3. To simulate flow of affected people in the Camp in order to test the logic of the Camp set up

Option to increase the challenge: There are additional arrivals of people and camp is overcrowded now. Team is tasked to map and organize acommodation and sevices in urban settings.

End with DEBRIEFING
