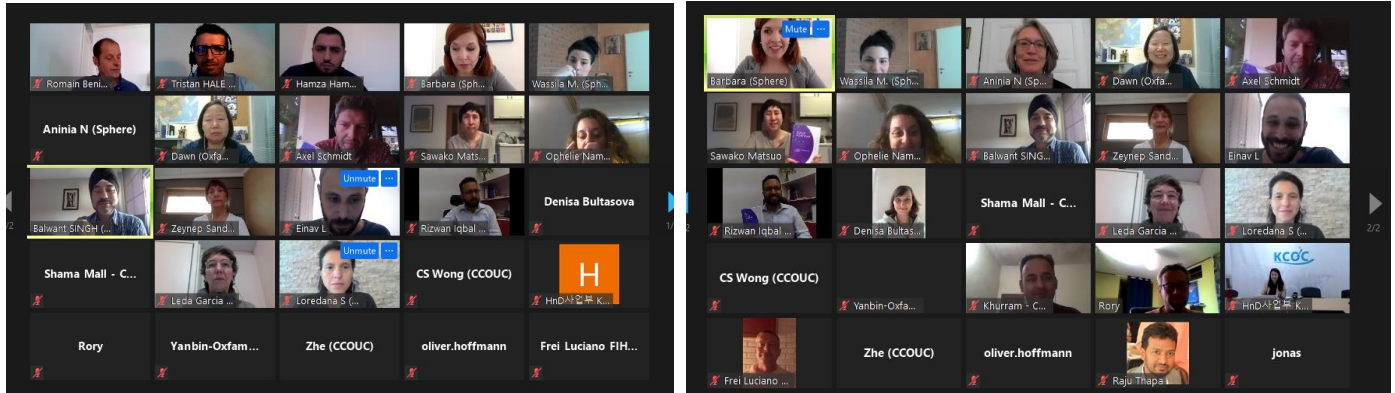

Background

Over the last few years, Sphere has been actively working to strengthen the country-based focal points network which now encompasses 56 Sphere focal points covering over 50 countries worldwide. In late 2017, Sphere hosted his first ever global Focal Points meeting. Building on this dynamic, Sphere has successfully organized a second edition of this meeting through videoconference in May 2020¹.

An invitation to take part in the meeting was sent to all Sphere focal points, representing various organisations and individuals. The invitation was extended to several Sphere trainers who have demonstrated continuous involvement with the Sphere secretariat.

Objectives

- Build on the dynamic from the previous Global Focal Points Meeting
- Update focal points on Sphere's latest developments
- Discuss issues put forward by the network through the online survey
- Identify opportunities for mutual collaboration and support
- Decide next steps (Global face to face meeting vs. regional face to face meetings)

Participation

Participation was high with twenty-three Focal Points joining the meeting in English, while another Focal Points meeting was held in Spanish in early July for country focal points based in Latin America and Caribbean countries to address more region-specific issues.

The first session was led by the Sphere Secretariat with the purpose of providing an update on the most recent developments regarding Sphere, namely the Focal points network, new training tools and resources as well as further information on the Humanitarian Standards Partnership (HSP). The following Q&A and plenary sessions allowed for further discussions on Covid-19 implications as well as regional coordination.

Despite the cancellation of this in-person event, the 2-hour video meeting provided an excellent opportunity to stay engaged with the Sphere network while discussing future work. The aim was to build upon this momentum and strengthen the Sphere secretariat exchanges with follow up meetings on the same model. The meeting was also helpful in identifying opportunities and challenges faced by focal points and how the Sphere secretariat could support the network.

Finally, some information on our COVID19-related activities were shared with participants, including on upcoming regional webinars on humanitarian standards in the COVID-19 response. Contribution from focal points to these webinars, planned between May and November 2020, was also discussed.

¹ This 3-day meeting was initially planned to take place face-to-face in Panama during the last week of May, but due to the global pandemic it was moved online.
