	<p>‘What is Sphere?’ and ‘Shelter and Settlement’. The translation has been shared with the previous Sphere Community Bangladesh Secretariat for review. After getting the consent and feedback from SCB, Shelter Cluster is currently in the process of hiring a consultant to harmonize the translations of those chapters.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → Food Security Cluster took the lead to translate the chapter on Food Security and Nutrition. They are in the process of ensuring that the translation is cohesive. → When hiring the consultant, it is recommended that a) s/he is a subject expert and b) has previous experience in translating English to Bengali. → Explore possibilities to make the translation accessible for the differently-abled through audio-visual languages, braille, etc. → Set a timeline to complete the preliminary translations by the respective clusters. 	<p>detailing steps to be taken (i.e. the methodology) for the translation process needs to be prepared first, and then reviewed properly by members and experts.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → Field-tests can be done in different dialectical geographical regions to ensure that the language is accessible to most Bengali-speakers. → Before the translation is finalized, each of the 4 focal groups need to field-test in consultation with sectoral experts. → Secretariat will communicate with the WASH and Health clusters for their engagement in translation of WASH and Health chapters. → A consultant can be hired after all the translation work is completed to harmonize the syntax. All members are requested for exploring funds.
